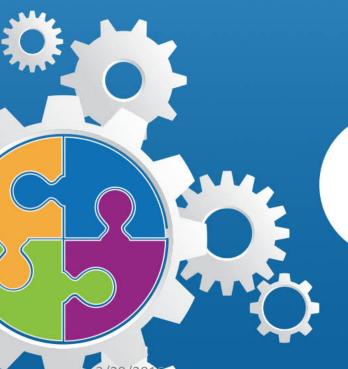

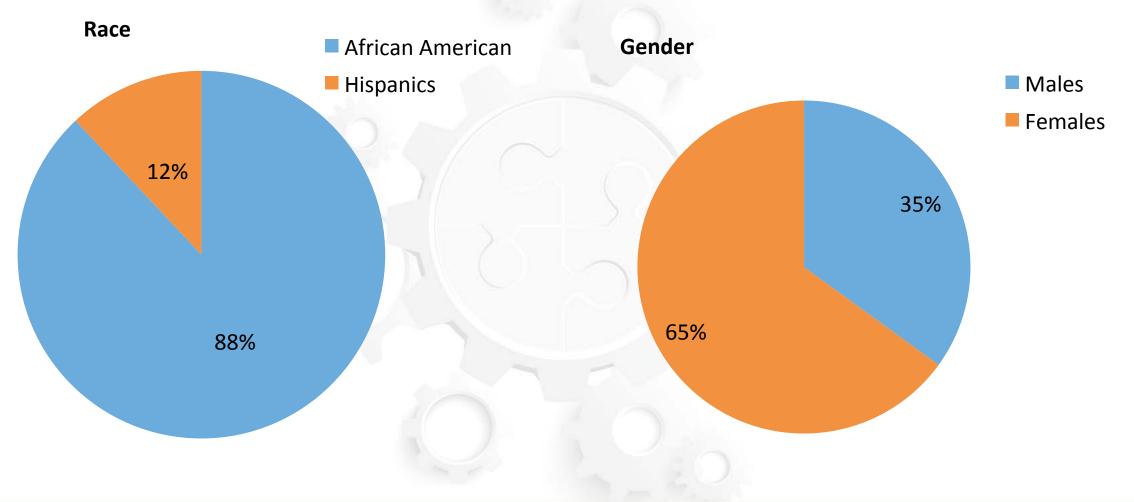
Themes from focus groups

- Stories from real people displayed in media





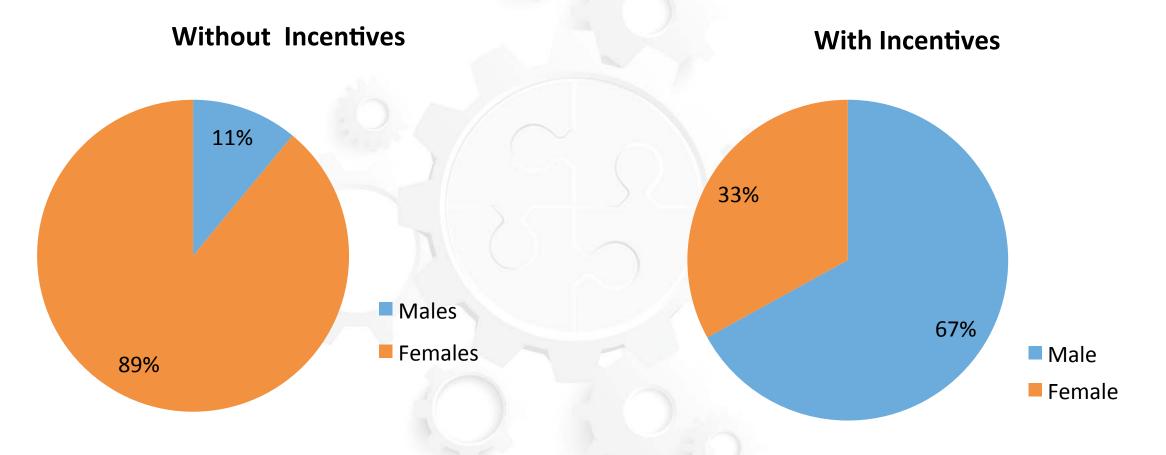

Outreach efforts

- To date outreach/in reach
 - Approx. 900 people
 - 491 current or past smokers
 - 54% African Americans
 - 40% Hispanics
 - 63 meet criteria for lung cancer screening
 - 22 meet pack year requirements, but less than 55 years of age

Rewards of Quitting

When you quit smoking you feel better emotionally, physically and financially.

You will live Longer!

Studies have shown that every cigarette smoked cuts minutes from your life. On average, non-smokers live 10 years longer.

You will be healthier!

You lower your risk of heart disease by 70%.

You are 20 times less likely to develop lung cancer and 4 times less likely to die from cancer.

For Men: Lower risk of developing impotence or low sperm count.

For Women: less susceptible to cervical and breast cancer. Also less likely to miscarriages and still birth. You also lower the risk of low birth weight in newborns.

You will look and feel better!

Smoking can cause shortness of breath and reduced stamina. It also affects your sense of taste and smell. By stopping you can have more energy to do things you want and have your sense of taste and smell return to normal.

You will save money!

Lets face it, smoking is expensive. On average, smoking cost about \$1600/yr per smoker. And that doesn't include the money you save on medical expenses incurred by smoking related issues.





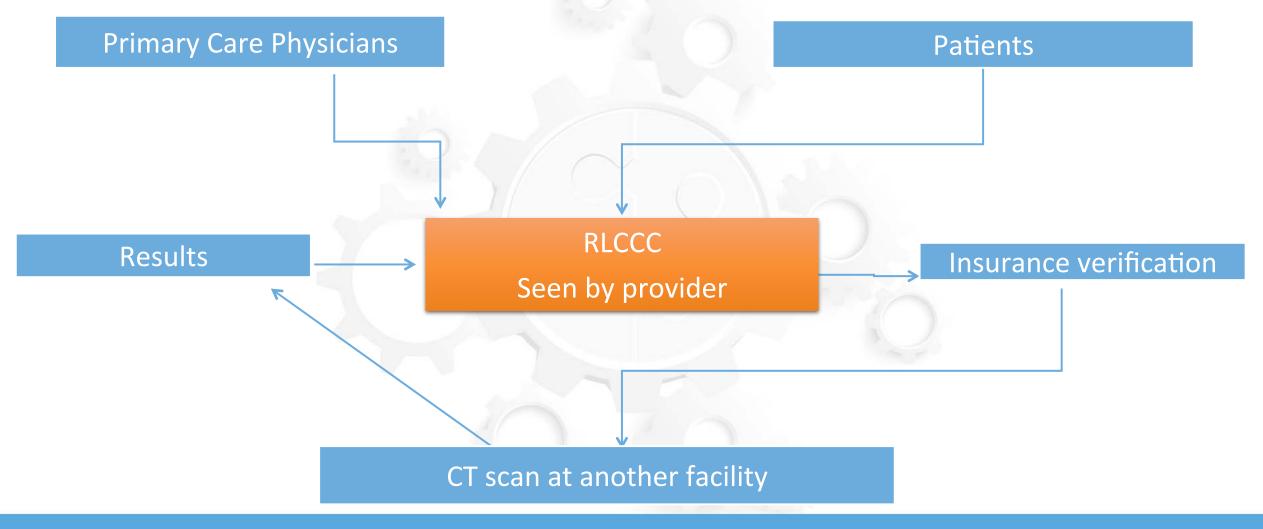
Challenges

- Patient Factors
 - Refuse screening altogether
 - High "no show" rates for CT scans
 - Low acceptance of smoking cessation
 - Cultural/ environmental acceptance of smoking
 - Lack of knowledge regarding risk of smoking

Physicians Challenges

- Primary reason for visit takes more time
- Not familiar with guidelines
- Current process of getting screened is cumbersome
- Fear of how to interpret finding or results



Early Lessons Learned

- Positive, affirmations, show people what can be gained with screening & cessation
- Develop a more "upbeat" message and materials
- Different mechanism for screening need to be considered
- Incentives work





Key Next Steps

- Navigate focus groups concerns into daily workflow
- Develop more affirmative outreach campaign
- Create a more streamline screening process





Patient story

A fifty eight year-old African American male with over 40 packs year visited the Ralph Lauren Center. He was hesitant to undergo a CT scan, because he was afraid to discover what his continued heavy smoking produced.

RLC nurses and navigators walked him through every step of the process, which did not show any suspicious results. However, as a result of the education offered at RLC, he quit smoking. Now, he's a RLC's patient advocate for lung cancer screening, and has spoken at community events to share his experience to help others overcome their fear of being screened.
