Introduction – Nelson Mandela Academic Hospital

- NMAH services a population of **3,6 million people** in the catchment area of Alfred Nzo and or Tambo municipalities.
- The **main referral hospital** for the rural and remote areas of the eastern part of the Eastern Cape Province. This region constitutes the former Transkei, which continues to be a labor reserve for the mining industry.
- Characterized by **poverty, high rates of illiteracy, poor access to basic health care services, poor infrastructure** (water, sanitation, poor infrastructure, roads, telecommunications, electricity).
- Of significance, this region has **no established reliable cancer service** and is dependent on the public tertiary facility in East London for radiotherapy services
- There is **poor access** to cancer awareness, early diagnosis, treatment and palliation. In response to the need for cancer care, NMAH has recently started a limited oncology service (without radiotherapy service) since April 2018

Overarching Goal Project Goal and Overview

- To establish an **Integrated Lung Cancer Centre of Excellence** and set up properly capacitated peripheral/satellite cancer care sites (district hospitals) in OR Tambo and Alfred Nzo Health Districts.
- This model aims **to achieve early diagnosis and treatment** of lung cancer and improve the quality of life in most rural communities through decentralization High-level overview of project

Our vision

To **change the hopelessness** associated with inconsistent and inadequate cancer management in our public health system to a position of state-of-the-art management of earlier stage disease detection, **improved accuracy in diagnosis** and palliation and decreased morbidity and mortality in our disadvantaged communities.
