

Melanoma

Lower cost of treatment Early detection is the most important predictor of melanoma survival and may also be associated with improved quality of life for patients. Surgery to remove early melanoma has proven to be curative for many patients over the course of 150 years. However, survival rates are roughly halved if regional lymph nodes are involved, emphasizing the importance of early intervention.
